A Word from the Rector

In our church calendar, today is officially the 15th Sunday after Trinity, but unofficially, it's "Welcome Back Sunday" as many of us, myself included, have been away on vacation. I am so grateful to Revd Nathaniel, for officiating and preaching in my absence, and for Beth Christianson and Henry Friesen for sharing in the preaching. Thank you also to all of you who carried forward the worship and Christian witness, at St. Mary's and for all your prayers for me and my family. It was an exciting trip to the Okanagan for my son Nicholas's wedding. Thank you to all who kindly donated to the wedding fund. What a blessing and a surprise! During the month of July I hand dipped some beeswax candles as a thank you to all the wedding guests. You will find a pair with your name on it in the basket on the landing.

Yesterday I stopped by the church and joined the other St. Mary's congregation that worships here on Saturday mornings: St. Mary's Ethiopian Orthodox Church. They had a big celebration for the Nativity (birthday) of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

While this has not been part of our actual liturgical life, if you look in the calendar of the Book of Common Prayer, you will see that September 8th has been set aside to celebrate Mary's birthday.

What's this all about? Why does it mean? The answer, quite simply, is that the story of our salvation begins with Mary. In response to the message of the angel, that she, though a virgin, was to conceive in her womb and give birth to the Son of God through the power of the Holy Spirit, Mary replied "Let it be unto me according to your word." Mary believed that "nothing is impossible to God." (Luke 1. 31-38), and so became the Birth-giver of God into the world. How natural that the Church should celebrate. The birthday of the woman from whom God" took flesh".

But the point is not just that Mary gave birth to the Son of God, but became the first person to share in His Divine life. Mary therefore is the prime exemplar of what it means to be a Christian. Through our assent and bodily self-surrender to the message of the Gospel, we too give birth to God in our lives and come to share His Divine life. So it is that at Christmas we will sing, in the words of "O Little town of Bethlehem" "Cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today!"

How does this happen? It happens when, in the face of impossible odds, with Mary, we say "Yes" to God. God wants to bring something new to birth in you, but you need to say "Yes" to Him, even though you have no idea what precise shape and form God's-Life-in-You is going to take. So it is, that with and through the Church, Mary's story becomes our story. It is the story of our salvation.

It's for this reason that the Ethiopian Church regards the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary as the start of new liturgical year. It's a time for saying "Yes" to God in the face of what seems an impossible situation, trusting that "nothing is impossible to God."

What a great way for us to start what feels like the beginning of a new year on Welcome Back Sunday and the resumption and renewal of church activities at St. Mary's.

Will you say "Yes" to God, "Yes" to the Gospel?

THE WORD OF THE LORD: TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

First Reading: 1 Peter 2:1-10

Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good. As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him—you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For in Scripture it says: "See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame." Now to you who believe, this stone is precious. But to those who do not believe, "The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, "and, "A stone that causes people to stumble and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the message—which is also what they were destined for. But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

GOSPEL: Matthew 28: 16-20

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
